

Thread by thread, Joe unravels the tapestry of Carl's conviction. But by the time Joe discovers the truth, it is too late to escape the fallout"--

The following Monday, February 1st we played at Pickerel Lake Concoria Lutheran. At that time we were one game behind them in the league standings going into the games. Both teams started out slow, but we won the first game by one run. They took the second game by 3 runs which took us to the final game. We were behind by 5 runs going into the 5th inning and put together a 6 run rally with 2 outs. We added 2 more runs in the 6th inning, and won that game 8 to 5 and took 2 of three games from them. Scott, Jerome, and Glen J. were top hitters for us that evening.

We were to play at Alden Monday February 8 but the games were cancelled because of the high winds and blowing snow. We then traveled to Ascension the following Monday. Ascension is the top team in the league and we were looking to change that. We lost the first game by one run. The second game we had an 8 run 4th inning and held until the last inning and they pulled ahead for the win. We went on to lose the third game by one run, so we lost all three games to Ascension. But we played them tough. Glen J. and Doug were top hitters for us that evening.

We have three nights remaining in regular league play. We play First Lutheran, at Glenville, and Mansfield. We are hoping to rebound to the win side and get into the top six to qualify for the end of the season single elimination tournament on banquet night. A lot can happen in three weeks to change the standings, but we'll be right in the thick of things to the end. Win or lose we always have fun playing dartball.

The Signs of "New Life..."

Last week as Lynda and I returned back to our home in the South Sioux City area, I got to thinking that shortly we will be spending the biggest part of our days at home each week doing yard work... cleaning up branches... raking up some of the leaves... putting down additional grass seed... getting the "old" ready for the "new"!

With the "new" of early spring right around the corner, soon we will be noticing early spring flowers beginning to push through the ground, and some of the trees beginning to show "new life". We'll even be noticing a Robin or two, and low flying geese beginning to head north... In and among it all, a song circles in my head. It's one that we sing periodically in a worship setting... "*The Canticle of Turning*":

My soul cries out with a joyful shout
That the God of my heart is great
And my spirit sings of the wondrous things
That you bring to the ones who wait
You fixed your sight on your servant's plight
And my weakness you did not spurn
So from east to west shall my name be blest
Could the world be about to turn

*My heart shall sing
Of the day you bring




